Exam Board: AQA

Course Outline for Y10:

Year 10 started the new GCSE maths course in the summer term of year 9. This new course awards grades 1 to 9 instead of grades G to A*. This new course is considerably more challenging with a grade 9 being above the old A*.

Weightings:

100% Written Examination

Paper 1 Non-Calculator 80 marks worth $33\frac{1}{3}$ of final grade.

Paper 2 Calculator 80 marks worth $33\frac{1}{3}$ of final grade.

Paper 3 Calculator 80 marks worth $33\frac{1}{3}$ of final grade.

All question papers will have a mix of question styles, from short, single-mark questions to multi-step problems. The mathematical demand increases as a student progresses through the paper.

What students should be doing to achieve:

- Attending all lessons.
- Completing all work set (Classwork and Homework).
- Coming to enrichment after school prepared with questions and topics that they need to work on.
- Taking onboard and acting upon feedback.

How parents / carers can help students achieve:

- Remind students of enrichment after school.
- Communicate with both teachers and students.
- Monitor a student's organisation and ensure that they are using their revision guide effectively.
