Re: Start of Academic Year 23/24 - Parental Update

After almost two full weeks back I thought I would contact you all and update you with the start of term. Firstly, I want to thank you all for supporting the school in ensuring your child is in full uniform and on time each morning. This is the best and calmest start to a year we have had and that starts with the expectations set at home. We have of course allowed students to not wear their blazers in the building during the heat wave this week, but we will return to full uniform from Monday, 11<sup>th</sup> September when the temperature is due to return to normal for September.

## **Results – Working Together**

I have been round to lots of lessons and students are focused, calm and working hard and if we work together to keep your child being active or ambitious in their learning, they will go on to great success. Speaking of success, we have now analysed our outcomes from last year and we were again overjoyed to be far above national averages. While our overall results are slightly down on last year, this is a reflection of the national drop in results caused by returning to 2019 levels of attainment. The gap between us and national and local figures remained significant and our students again, did amazing things in their exams. I know that exam results are not the be all and end all in terms of success, but better grades open more doors and make lifelong success easier. Sustaining these excellent outcomes reflects the hard work of our staff, our students, and our families. Our community can achieve great things when we work together, as we have shown yet again.

## **Road Traffic Safety**

With three large secondary schools in a very small area, traffic will always be an issue but at the start of the year it is always more acute. Please can I ask that if your child is able to walk or cycle that they do so. If this is not possible, please ensure you drop them further away from the school. If we can work together, hopefully we can avoid restrictions being put in place.
