KS3 Performing Arts

Course Outline for Key Stage 3:

In KS3 Performing Arts, students will explore a range of performance skills: from the use of dramatic techniques and their impact on an audience; to performing extracts of text and movement; to devising their own performance and evaluating live theatre. In lessons students will work practically to understand the role of a performer, dancer, actor, director and designer, whilst continually developing their performance and writing skills.

As well as the subject skills students will also be developing their understanding of working as an ensemble and the importance of collaboration with others. Developing positive working relationships with all of those in their form through learning how to discuss, challenge, build on one another's ideas and establish consensus in a creative environment. The KS3 Performing Arts curriculum gives students the skills to progress within the subject, the opportunity to express themselves creatively, whilst also developing their understanding of building relationships and how to be a positive member in the community.
